**Instructions:** Choose something that is in your house and describe it using 5 sentences. The one rule is that in those 5 sentences you must try to appeal to the 5 human senses of touch, taste, smell, hearing, and sight.

Example: Mr. Hollands Coffee cup

1. The cup on my desk is a deep dark red. **(Sight)**
2. As I bring the cup closer to my mouth, I am reminded of the smell of fresh espresso beans. **(Smell)**
3. When I am holding the cup, it is as rough as cardboard. **(Touch)**
4. When I give the cup a small shake, I can hear the coffee move side to side in the coffee cup like a wave. **(Sound)**
5. When I look at the coffee inside the cup, it looks like a smooth caramel colour like a Werthers caramel candy. **(sight + taste)**

### The Deadliest Cat in the World

**Instructions:** Read the short paragraph about the black-footed cat and watch the video linked below (Video Optional). Answer the questions on the following page.

The black-footed cat is a nocturnal species found in Southern Africa. They are considered the deadliest cat in the world with a success rate of 60% on all their hunts. The black-footed cats were appropriately named after their black pads and darkened fur around their paws, and only reach about three pounds when fully grown. That is about 200 times less than the typical lion. The small cat can also capture more prey in a single night than a leopard does in six months. Black-footed cats are considered vulnerable to extinction, which means that their numbers are doing okay for now, but soon we could see that change.
