### Indigenous Student Enrollment and Demographics

Our school district's data reveals a diverse distribution of Indigenous students throughout our schools. We proudly serve 2,042 Indigenous learners spread across 18 schools within our district. It's worth noting that this figure doesn't include students from the Northwest Trades & Employment Training Centre (NTETC), as they are registered through their respective schools.

Indigenous students in our district are spread across several areas. Terrace has 1,091 Indigenous students, Hazelton/Kitwanga area has 595 students, Kitimat has 313 and Stewart has 13 Indigenous students. This distribution highlights the wide-ranging presence of Indigenous learners throughout our district's various regions.

All data presented is as of December 2024; however, the District is allocated enhanced targeted funding for 1923 indigenous students based on the September 2024 Ministry of Education and Child Care 1701 report.

Total Students: The total student headcount based upon enrolment data collections.

**Status, On-Reserve:** An individual who is registered as a status Indigenous person and who lives on a First Nations reserve.

Status, Off-Reserve: An individual who is registered as a status Indigenous person and does not reside on a First Nations reserve.

**Non-Status:** commonly refers to people who identify themselves as Indigenous, Metis, and Inuit but who are not entitled to registration on the Indigenous Register or have not applied with Indigenous Services Canada.

Métis: 1 of 3 recognized Indigenous Peoples in Canada, along with First Nations and Inuit.

Inuit: 1 of 3 recognized Indigenous Peoples in Canada, along with First Nations and Métis.
