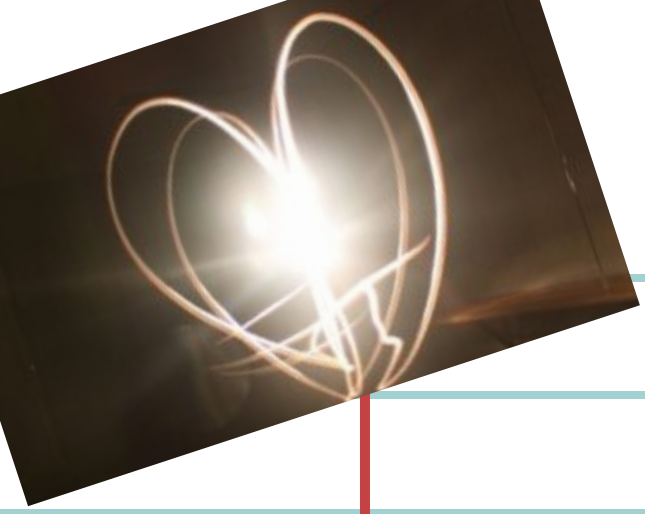

Caledonia is a grade 10-12 school located on the unceded territory of the Tsimshian people.





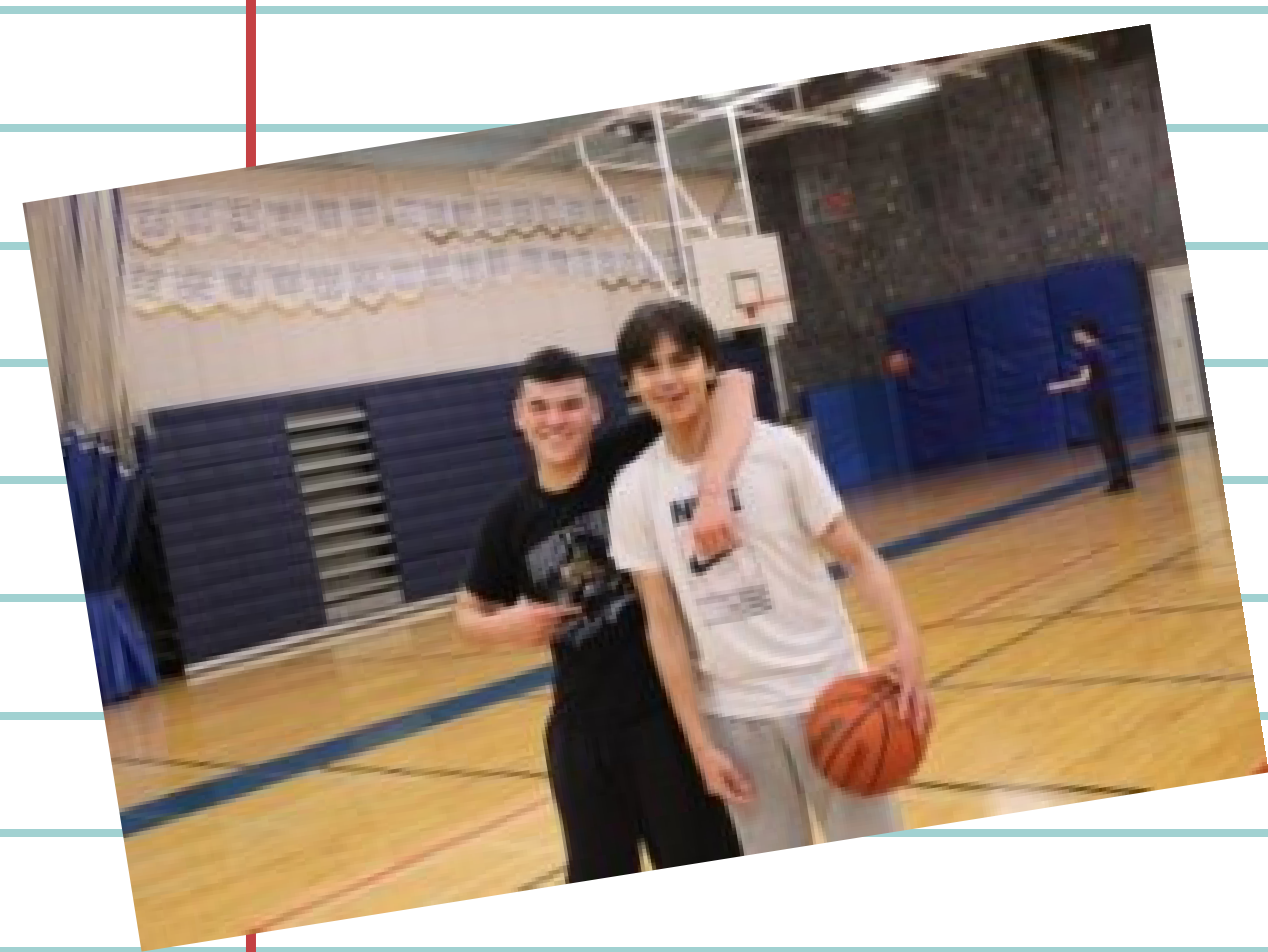
Caledonia Cares

OUR LEARNERS

Caledonia is a Grade 10-12 school, we have 556 kind, caring and resilient students. We have a diverse student population, with approximately 34% of our total student population identifying as Indigenous. Caledonia students are successful, with 82-90% of our student body successfully completing classes. Attendance/absenteeism and engagement are one of our biggest concerns for our student body.



OUR CONTEXT

Caledonia Secondary is the largest high school in CMSD 82. We are located in Terrace, BC which is situated on Traditional Tsimshian territory. We tend to students' holistic growth and development. We strive to create a safe and caring learning environment, ripe with multiple opportunities for student exploration and success. We work with families and communities to support all students. Our community is welcoming and diverse.

INDIGENOUS PERSPECTIVE

We would like to support awareness of indigenous culture, knowledge and history by: all grade 10 learners enroll in English First Peoples 10. We want to bring awareness to issues of significance to the Indigenous community by continuing to consciously observe and acknowledge the following: Orange Shirt Day, Red Dress Day, Indigenous Peoples History Month.



OUR FOCUS

Caledonia will focus on trauma-informed practices and approaches to improve outcomes for students, many of whom have experienced a significant decline in their academic engagement and mental wellness.

- Supports to foster success include: support for food, clothing, transportation, academic supports and social-emotional interventions.
- Another significant focus will be on improving our absenteeism challenges, to get kids to school.

OUR NEXT STEPS

Staff will focus on trauma-informed practices and approaches to improve outcomes for learners.

- Improving student literacy skills.
- Collaborate with teachers from Skeena Middle School to support successful transitions.
- Supporting differentiated instruction through resource and staff learning opportunities.
- Emphasize the importance of attendance and engagement with courses.
