As the year progresses, the district will use key indicators to measure progress on the journey towards improved levels of student learning and well-being in inclusive and welcoming classrooms and schools.

### Goal: All students will realize their full potential

- Ongoing research of evidence-based classroom literacy practices and inventory of current classroom instruction and assessment literacy practices in Coast Mountains
